My Mother Is

Theme:

Mothers! Most countries have some sort of celebration of motherhood, and this script has been tested and loved in schools and churches on such occasions. It could equally well be used at any other time of the year—the love of a mother is forever! There are plenty of funny lines (reflecting life, where children are unpredictable in what they say) but the children start and end by saying lovely things about their mothers. Expect everyone to be touched!

Cast:

NARRATOR Could be at the side of the stage, or a voice off over a

microphone.

ONE
TWO
Perhaps 13 16 years old
Perhaps 10 – 13 years old
Perhaps 7 10 years old

Notes:

This is designed to be easily usable by children with minimum preparation. TWO, ONE and THREE are standing on stage in that order, so the eldest is in the middle and the youngest last. The lines are delivered in that order so they will always know when it is their turn. It would be alright for them to read their lines – the NARRATOR says the parts are played by actors – but don't make the mistake of thinking that no rehearsal is necessary! They will all be a lot more confident and fluent if they have read through it a few times. If they are not used to doing this make sure that they each have a copy of the script with their own lines highlighted.

If you think it would work better in your situation, feel free to change "mother" to "mum" or "mom", but before deciding to do that read the lines aloud with the change to see how it sounds.

NE My mother gave birth to me. She tells me that a lot, mainly when she wants to

stop me complaining about something.

HREE My mother is mean. Sometimes she piles all my toys in the middle of the bedroom floor and tells me that if I don't sort them out she will give them to

other girls and boys who will take better care of them. She usually ends up

helping me though.

My mother and I sing along to all the songs on the radio. She knows every

single song ever sung!

NE My mother is just waiting for Brad Pitt. That's what she tells Dad anyway.

HREE My mother likes pretty things. She also likes expensive things, like perfume

and champagne.
